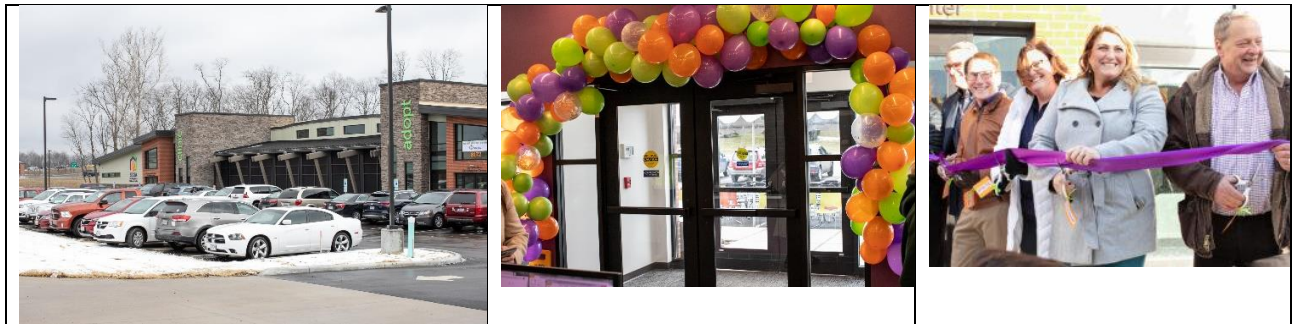




2021 Annual Report to the Community on 2020 Impact

Annually, we provide a report to the community on the previous year's activities. For many of us, 2020 was a life-changing year. At SICSA, we started 2020 in celebration, with our monumental move to our new facility in Washington Township.

Six weeks later, COVID hit the United States in a drastic way. We operated a bit differently in 2020 to compensate for all the changes we incurred. Below is a snapshot of SICSA's impact in 2020:

The Help Center

While the heart of SICSA has historically been adoptions and placements, the Help Center took a leading role in 2020. COVID-19 was not only a medical pandemic, it hit families financially. SICSA's Help Center works to try and keep animals in their home through intake diversion efforts such as the provision of information and resources, as well behavioral, medical, and even temporary boarding.

While in our care, every need of the animal is met by our dedicated animal care team. This includes a clean and comfortable living space, yummy food, socialization, exercise, and enrichment. They also are evaluated and treated by (in our humble opinion) the best Veterinary Team around. This includes 14,646 different veterinary services to the animals awaiting adoption.

Adoption & Placement
